FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MICHAEL NEW YEAR

This weekend, we begin a calendar New Year, and there will be much discussion about New Year's resolutions. The proverbial yearly favorite is to lose weight (selected by over 60% of people recently surveyed). Some resolutions will be concerning financial progress, and others about making new friends. Rarely mentioned is a new relationship with God. Why?

Is it that God is taken for granted? Is it that we will go to heaven no matter our sins? Is it that God doesn't really matter much? In all cases, and examples, they are bad decisions to avoid the most important relationship one can have in life.

With the turning of the calendar, it's time to seek out God, and realize the importance of God in our life. It means developing a relationship and planning on how we can really grow in a better love of Him.

A relationship with God is easy, yet hard. First, in a culture and society that is very absorbed in itself, it means self-denial. Self-denial does not necessarily mean a financial decision but rather denying oneself of the spotlight being placed on oneself. It means a willingness to give freely to the will of God, and have a willingness to serve. It means thinking of someone before thinking of oneself, and don't always do something for self-gratification, or praise. Secondly, it means removing the things of this world that absorb all my time and thus cause little or no time with God. Like every relationship, one must be willing to give some time to the relationship through prayer, meditation, spiritual reading, and receiving the sacraments by attending Mass weekly. Lastly, it means being people of faith, and hope. Know that God is hearing you, and ready to be there, and that one day there will be a better day through hope.

So, as we closed out a crazy, and for some a very difficult year, we look to this New Year with much hope. May this be the year that you make a purposeful effort to get closer to God, and be ready to find that new relationship with Him.

We have been alerted by a large number of parishioners who have been very sick with the stomach flu. Since we wish not to expose parishioners to any potential illnesses, in this heightened time, we are suspending the distribution of the Precious Blood this weekend, and will resume when we get through the peak of the illness. It is important to bear in mind that we have no reports of illnesses after reception of the Precious Blood, but rather we are acting out of the abundance of caution. The practice of receiving the Precious Blood is purely an option, and one receives both the Body and Blood of the Lord when they receive the host. Further, unlike other parishes who suspend the use of Precious Blood each winter and flu season, or never have the Precious Blood offered, we have offered it each week, but there are times we must consider all health concerns in the community as well.
