SHORT BIO OF FATHER KAMIL

Fr. Kamil Stachowiak was born in Rawicz, Poland, September 16, 1988, son of Joseph and Ewa Stachowiak. Before he came to the U.S. he attended Mikolaj Kopernik High School in Leszno. He entered the seminary in Poznan, where he spent 5 years studying at Adam Mickiewicz University. In 2012 he moved to seminary in Cracow and continued his study at Pontifical University of John Paul II. In 2013 he graduated and obtained master degree in theology. He wrote a thesis in philosophical anthropology entitled "The concept of a human being and his relationship to the society in the philosophy of Jean Jacques Maritain and the classics of Marxism (Marx, Engels, Lenin). A comparative study."

Also in 2013, Fr. Kamil came to the U.S. and was studying ESL (English as a Second Language) at Rutgers University in Newark residing at Holy Family Parish in Florham Park, NJ. May 16, 2014, His Excellence Bishop Arthur J. Serratelli ordained him a deacon and a year later, May 23, 2015 he was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Paterson. Fr. Kamil served as a priest at St. Matthew the Apostle Parish in Randolph and Holy Rosary Church/Diocesan Shrine of Saint John Paul II in Passaic. In 2017 he was assigned as a parochial vicar to Our Lady Queen of Peace in Hewitt.

Fr. Kamil is interested in philosophy, foreign languages (modern and ancient), and travelling. He also enjoys roller skating, rafting and playing tennis. His greatest joy in being a priest is being able to see people recognize their gifts of service and become involved in parish life; enabling people in good times and bad find the presence of God in their lives and in celebrating the sacraments.

Fr. Kamil loves working with young people saying that, "there is nothing more uplifting and inspiring than seeing a group of young people gathered in God's name". In his previous assignments he created two youth groups: AXIS Youth Group in Randolph and SEED Youth Group in Passaic.

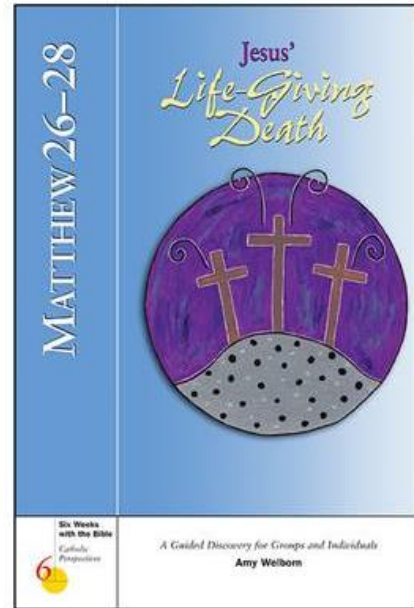
